Dear Essentials Class Members,

During online class time we ask that you commit to leaving your video feed on so that instructors and class members can all see each other which will enhance a sense of connection and community.

The subject may be any topic of your choice related to course content and may be submitted at any point during the year but no later than March 21, 2023. The paper will not be graded but will be read and returned to you with comments by an Essentials committee member.

Early in the year we ask that the class select a class representative who will then be able to connect with the Essentials Committee around any issues or questions that may arise for the class as a whole. In addition the representative may also help facilitate internal class discussion around possible activities such as a study group or pre/post seminar discussions for example. Such activities are not prescribed and are entirely students' prerogative and at students' discretion. Any class member is free to contact the Essentials committee should questions or concerns arise.

Class membership entitles you to attend TICP Scientific Meetings which are usually held on Wednesday evenings periodically throughout the year. Class membership also entitles you to a student discount for any TICP workshops, usually held on Saturdays.
